TEXAS/MEXICO

In December of 2015, Healing Hands partnered with the North Pharr Church of Christ, the 8th and Harlingen Church of Christ, and the Harvey Drive Church of Christ in southern Texas to distribute 5300 M.A.G.I. boxes to children in Mexico and along the border in Texas. The M.A.G.I. boxes at the North Pharr Church of Christ were distributed by local hispanic preachers who work with congregations on both side of the border. The Harvey Drive Church of Christ reached out to the school district in McAllen and worked with each school to come up with a list of children who would benefit from receiving a M.A.G.I. box.
