Beatrice, 37, is a mother of four. She was very thankful for the training as it provided hope for a better farm harvest. She was all smiles as she said, "My home is just over the fence to this church compound. I am going to begin my own garden tomorrow and will be comparing my harvest with this demonstration site."

Expenses totaled \$3,996,347 of which \$3,530,324 (88.3%) was used for programs and reserves, \$319,933 (8.0%) for administrative costs, and \$146,089 (3.7%) for fundraising costs. Living a Dream

Rhoda Bosibori Bikundo is 90 years old. She lives in the Nyamesocho village in Kisii, Kenya. After Healing Hands International conducted an agricultural workshop in 2017, Rhoda was a vital part of starting the Samaria Church of Christ in the community.

Rhoda has many children and grandchildren. When asked how many she had she said, "I have so many children...it is a difficult question for me to answer....to differentiate those who have passed away and those that are still alive." She expressed her thanks to HHI for the positive transformation that has come to the community. **"It has always been my dream to see water flowing in this community but never thought it will become a reality in my lifetime."** She continued, "since I was a

child, I have walked many kilometers to the neighboring Maasai community to get water. Almost every year, there has been intercommunal war between us over it." Through these communal clashes she lost two of her children. One, Thomas Masore, is "lucky to be alive" but lost one of his eyes during the fight for water.



"I am so thankful to HHI for preaching peace and salvation, for bringing life to this community." Thomas Masore (Rhoda's son) was among those who were baptized into Christ as a result of the water well in the community. The water well now serves the entire community and neighboring Maasai village. Praise God for new beginnings!
