






Financials

The total income for 2019 was \$4,803,875. Expenses totaled \$4,262,761 of which \$3,789,964 (88.9%) was used for programs and reserves, \$324,854 (7.6%) for administrative costs, and \$147,943 (3.5%) for fundraising costs.

The Faces of Healing Hands International

While the numbers in this 2019 Annual Report provide important information related to the impact of donations and ministry work, they do not tell the whole story. Those who are served and those who are serving are the best evidence of how God's work is being done. Here are just a few of the faces that we have come to know and love.

Agriculture Education

Mbwenu Chirwa is our talented and devoted agriculture trainer in Malawi. He teaches effective gardening techniques as well as poultry, dairy cattle and fish farming skills to more than 200 people each year through community "field days" and workshops. His ingenuity and drive have extended to his wife and others in the village of Tombolombo, who have formed a farmer's co-op, a grain mill, and a bakery. He also serves as a Bible school teacher, a preacher for the Tombolombo Church of Christ, and a Biblical facilitator in AIDS prevention.





Clean Water

Rebecca Zacchaeus is a remarkable 20-year old single mother who lives in the Nyankpani village in the Yendi district of Ghana. She is just one of many examples of how the gift of clean water can transform a life. After she attended an HHI agriculture workshop in her village, the additional gift of water empowered Rebecca to put her new skills into action. The daily task of walking miles on a long, busy road to bring water home has been replaced with cleaner water much closer to home. Rebecca can defeat poverty because she is

healthier and has the time needed to pursue additional income for her small family.

Disaster Relief

Serena Brown is a fighter who was not defeated by Hurricane Dorian in the Bahamas, even when her home was almost completely destroyed. Because so many generous hearts came together to help, this single mother of three is slowly putting her life back together. She is now living with her mother and her brother while her home is being repaired through the efforts of Healing Hands and our partners. Repairs are also being made to the home of Serena's 81-year old mother, Bernice Brown, which was destroyed. Serena is a graduate of Oklahoma Christian University and a social worker for the Bahamian Government.

Women of Hope

Like so many girls in Africa, **Abigail** has faced great difficulties in her short life. At the age of eight, her parents made the difficult decision to give her to a man with the promise that he would wait until she was older to marry. This man broke his promise, so Abigail chose to run away. She was fortunate that local police placed her with God's Will Training Institute (a Women of Hope partner in Ghana), and she began to receive training to become a dressmaker. She has since been baptized into Christ and recently completed her final exams. Abigail's future is

bright because women here in the U.S. gave her the opportunity to completely change the direction of her life!
